Oak gin delivers a warm finish as lovely as a sipping gin/whisky; rich oak spice and brown honey toast finishing on sweet caramel, vanilla and sugarcane.



Woodlands Selection Chardonnay 2018

€ 12.90

Enticing pale straw in colour, the sweet and creamy bouquet is fragrant with honey, herbs and citrus with notes of toasty vanilla. It possesses a lovely, well-balanced depth of soft, creamy, melon fruit and toasted oak, and comes to a sumptuous conclusion with a long, dry finish. This wine can be cellared for up to three years. Try this one with chargrilled seafood.

Woodlands Selection Shiraz Rose

€ 12.90

This fruity number is made from 100% Shiraz grapes. The fruit was crushed and held in the press where it was cold macerated for 24 hours to extract colour from the skins. The wine displays fresh fruit characters of cherry and strawberry both on the nose and palate. The palate is off dry and displays summer red berry fruit characters which linger and finish fresh and dry. Drink and enjoy over the summer months!

• Woodlands Selection Shiraz Cabernet 2019

This medium red coloured wine exudes aromas of dry spice, leather, and earthy mineral aromas. On the palate the wine has a good helping of soft redcurrant flavours balanced by smooth tannins and spicy oak at the finish. Serve with stir fried chicken and beef dishes.

Rewen means "sacred place" in Mapuche language. It represents that which is discovered in the deepest and most sensitive core of our existence. The Cuyo Valley is blessed by a unique climate that combines excellent grape-growing conditions: extended sunshine hours, high daytime temperatures and low night-time temperatures, together with a relatively low humidity. It is a place where, without irrigation, it would be impossible to grow vines and is a place where the human touch is indispensable. The capacity, knowledge and ability associated with this can be seen in the high quality of grapes produced.

o Las Mondes Sauvignon Blanc 2019. Central Valley, Chile

The grapes are harvested in the early morning, crushed and destemmed. The juice is cold settled overnight before racking. Cold fermentation takes place in stainless steel tanks for 21 days. The wine is aged on its lees for 4 months. No wood is used in the ageing process. A tropical nose with gooseberry, asparagus and hints of bell pepper. The abundance of flavours carry through onto the palate with a fresh, crisp acidity. Best enjoyed with seafood, lightly flavoured pasta or sushi.

• Rewen Estate Malbec 2019 . Cuyo Valley, Mendoza, Argentina

100% Malbec cultivated on sandy loam, with full malolactic fermentation. Aged in 25% French and 75% American oak for six months. Deep red-violet colour and a beautiful viscosity in the glass. Aromas of blackberry, plums and a touch of raspberry combined with vanilla notes from the oak. Opulent and round with soft, balanced tannins and a smooth, lingering finish. Excellent paired with red meat, game, tomato-based pasta sauces and full-flavoured cheeses.

Owners Ben and Naomi Gould started making wines from their sustainably farmed vineyard in 2009, they now run 28 Ha of certified Organic vineyards, built a (legal) winery, are raising two young boys, adopted a 30-year-old French son (also known as employee #1, Simon), elected Neko the vineyard cat, wrangled Leroy and his flock of hippie chicks, plus rehomed a million or so of Simon's bees. All whilst developing their natural ethos of minimising outside influences where possible.

50% Chenin Blanc & 50% Sauvignon Blanc, wild ferment in stainless steel. The result is a classic dry white, with enough sweetness to give your taste buds something to dance around. The fruit comes from our Quindalup vineyard and is simply made in a stainless steel tank for freshness. A juicy, racy, gluggable white with stone fruit and grassy notes that well delivers on its promise.

Blind Corner Orange 2021

Sauvignon Blanc & Chenin Blanc, blended in a rolling wild ferment. All skins are left in through the process to add tannin tang and a wonderful mouth texture. The result is a cloudy, yellow / orange-coloured wine that tastes like rainbows and textured like sun. We blend this bit with 3x neutral wild ferment vessel action and add a teeny dash - like teeny - of some estate grown Cabernet to bring it home and makes your eyes understand what your tongue is trying to tell you.

Blind Corner Rouge 2020

€ 19.90

Shiraz 75%, Cabernet 20% & 5% Merlot. All reds foot-crushed, hand-plunged and basket pressed to old oak. Blend the lingering spice of Shiraz and the rich upfront flavour and lingering aftertaste of Cabernet, with the silky soft consistency of Merlot, and you have a Rouge of super delicious deliciousness. This blend has been simply foot-crushed, hand-plunged during wild ferment and basket pressed to old oak for some sleepy time.

When Sliding Hill was pushed out of the sea, rock was crushed like grapes in a press. Wind and water then sprinkled loose soil, rich in minerals over our land. It created a prefect bed for raising Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. At Sliding Hill in Marlborough New Zealand, with a little help from nature, we have created wine whose depth, complexity and character and literally off the Richter scale.

Sliding Hill Sauvignon Blanc 2021

€ 18.50

In its youth the wine is moderate straw in colour with green tints. Aromas are reserved and quite exotic with hints of lime, peach, honeysuckle, passionfruit and gooseberry. Ripe flavours of sweet gala apples, lime and rich tropical fruits predominate in a lush textured style with a long dry grainy finish. The wine will drink superbly when young. To be consumed wherever there is sun, surf or seafood.

Sliding Hill Pinot Noir 2019



The wine is a dark black-purple in colour, denser than all but the finest vintage pinot noir. Aromatically complex and lifted, the fine hazelnut aromas of oak and lees grace the intense violet and creamed black-fruit characters. The silky, classic Pinot Noir palate is driven by warm ripe black-cherry and doris-plum flavours, hints of cola nut and intense mushroom. An almost atypical Pinot tannin structure is the result of a fantastic vintage and reflects the potential of the Marlborough site. The weight, length and intensity of the wine promise a cellaring potential of at least seven years from vintage.

Hundred Tree Hill Shiraz 2017


Black as tar in colour, with a ring of Ox blood around the glass. Beef stock, treacle, iron filings, sweaty leather, raw, hung meat, fresh coffee, bush fires, cedar, cigarbox, peppercorns, cooking chocolate, mushroom, blackberries, beetroot, stewed plums, mixed peel and Chinese five spice are all suggested by the intoxicating fumes rising from a very large glass of this wine. The wine swirls onto the palate, creamy, viscous and rich, then explodes mid-palate with freshly crushed raspberry juice, blackberry, juniper and plum. This leads on to gamey, meaty characters and further complexity, followed by the familiar savoury, spicy characters of new American oak. The finish is well structured with fine tannin and the flavours linger long after the wine is finished. Great with rare beef, kangaroo, game meats, hard cheeses or just on its own.

Redbank Sally's Paddock 2016

€ 78.00

Sally's Paddock was first released in 1979 and is Neill Robb's crown jewel.. A lovely deep garnet colour, with aromas of violets, morello cherries, cloves and a hint of blackberries. Intense and delightful whilst soft, balanced, silky and smooth on the palate showing mouth filling Autumn berry flavours. Married with subtle new American and Nevers Oak, the Sally's Paddock makes a complete and delicious wine. The Sally's Paddock name has earned an international reputation as a great wine for immediate consumption or for those with the patience to cellar for 10 plus years. The Sally's Paddock has also received two Gold Medals in the London International Wine Challenge and has been included in the 'Excellent A' section of the Langtons Classifications for the past 15 years.

Bellvale Winery

Established in 1998, Bellvale Wine is a family-owned business run by principal winemaker and viticulturalist, John Ellis. Situated in the lush Tarwin River valley of South Gippsland, the area is acknowledged as one of Australia's best Pinot-Noir producing regions. The name, Bellvale, is derived from the Ellis family's rich agricultural heritage, which may be traced back to a farm in Nieuw Amsterdam (the New York area), in the late 1600s. The Bellvale label features two majestic oak trees that grace the centre of its vineyard.

Bellvale Gippsland Chardonnav 2019

Sourced exclusively from our Gippsland vineyard, this sophisticated and multidimensional wine shows good rich fruit characters of apple and melon, highlighted by a malolactic ferment and 12 months ageing in new and one year old French oak barriques. Tight, flinty with cedary spicy and savoury highlights and an excellent purity. Cool climate acid results in a beautifully textured, creamy, nutty, balanced character. Fruit richness is carried through on the palate to produce a wonderful finish. It is anticipated the wine will improve for 3 to 5 years in the bottle to reach maximum potential and then age gracefully under the Stelvin cap. Drink with creamy seafood dishes.

• Bellvale Gippsland Pinot Noir 2020

€ 27.50

Like so many of our wines the 2008 Pinot Noir has shown dramatic bottle development. Good lifted fruit characters are obvious and will continue to develop for another couple of years. As the palate softens with age and the fruit integrates with the tannins, the structure of the wine will become softer and more rounded. Lifted fragrant nose with raspberry, cherry, strawberry, a touch of spice and smoky complexity with hints of smoky bacon. Savoury, earthy, vegetal characters offer a lean but complex and elegant wine. Fine soft grained tannins on the palate with good oak balance. Round soft finish with great length. Excellent with any game dishes.

Auntsfield Estate

Auntsfield Estate is run under the watchful eye of the Cowley family and is the home of Marlborough's first colonial vineyard and winery. The dramatic hillside vineyard with its unique variety of soils is the inspiration to produce exciting hand crafted wines of balance and individuality that display the special terroir of this historic Marlborough vineyard. The original vineyard was established in 1873 by Marlborough's original winemaker, David Herd. Herd made highly regarded wine for over 50 years before the property reverted to sheep farming.

Winemaker . Luc Cowley Established . 1998 Production . 2,000 cases

o Auntsfield Estate Single Vineyard Sauvignon Blanc 2020

€ 22.50

Cool fermentation with cultured yeast in stainless steel tanks assisted in retaining the fresh varietal aromatics. This was balanced by a portion of the fruit subjected to traditional winemaking practices; handpicked, whole bunch pressed and fermented in seasoned oak barrels, adding texture and length to the wine. Pale straw in colour with lifted and pure aromas of fresh passionfruit, gooseberries and lime. Notes of dried herbs, lemongrass, jalapeno and blackcurrant add pungency and intensity to the aromatics. The wine displays intense ripe fruit flavours of passionfruit juice and white peach, with citrus notes of lime and mandarin pith. The palate has intense concentration and generous weight, balanced by an underlying minerality and tight structure to shape a wine with lively tension and textural balance.

Auntsfield Estate Single Vineyard Chardonnay 2019

€ 27.50

The juice was fermented in French oak barriques, with a combination of indigenous and cultured yeast, followed by extended barrel ageing on yeast lees. Rich straw gold in colour, aromas are intense and complex displaying nectarine, apricot and mandarin peel integrated with vanilla pod and hazelnut from the French oak influence. The palate shows ripe stone fruit flavours of nectarine, peach and dried apricot, integrated with a flinty minerality and subtle French oak influence giving hints of roasted hazelnut. A well-structured and seamless wine with excellent length and complexity.

Auntsfield Estate Single Vineyard Pinot Noir 2019

€ 29.50

This wine was made with a minimalist philosophy, designed to enable the characteristics of the grapes and the vineyard to be revealed. The fruit was hand-harvested, hand-sorted, gently de-stemmed and gravity-fed to tank. Fermented with a combination of indigenous and cultured yeasts, careful hand plunging assisted to gently extract flavours and tannins from the skins. Maturation occurred in French oak barriques for approximately 10 months. Deep ruby crimson in colour with aromas of dark cherry, blueberry and black plum complimented by more savoury aromas of cassis, tea leaf, floral notes of dried rosemary, dried spices and forest floor. The palate shows a rich silky texture which is full and concentrated. Interwoven flavours of spice, dark fruit and savoury characters are revealed by a succulent and fine tannin structure. The structure of this wine is tight, yet rich and full with seamless length.

The eighty acre Liebichwein vineyard is family owned and operated by Ron and Janet Liebich, Ron is very much hands-on in the vineyard and the winery. The crushing of grapes is contracted to another small winery where Ron has a hand in the crushing and basket-pressing of the wine. The fruit is from a prime location situated on the eastern slopes of the valley at Rowland Flat, not far from Jacobs Creek. Ron has honed his skills during many years of winemaking at the Rowland Flat family winery (Rovalley Wines) started by his grandfather Benno Liebich in 1919 and sold in 1985.

• Liebich The Potters Merlot 2012

€ 29.50

A warm summer resulted in fruit of great elegance, while still retaining great depth and intensity. Pungent mulberry and cherry aromas in perfect harmony with the wood, followed by intense blackcurrant flavours on the palate, allow this sensuous wine to be enjoyed now, but 2–3 years bottle age would be recommended before opening, will cellar for at least fifteen years.

Liebich The Darkie Shiraz 2010

€ 43.00

This unfiltered wine exhibits the deep, dark, silky, rich, full, plummy style for which the area is famous. The pomegranate crispness in the colour and fruit flavours is indicative of the excellent growing season, with the depth of flavour attributed to the low one and a half tonnes per acre yield, brought about by the 32 year old vines suffering from "dead arm" affliction. A combination of new and American and French oak balances the delightful fruit to perfection. Although able to be savoured early, the wine will reward 12 years and more in the bottle. SCARPA was founded in the second half of the eighteenth century by a Venetian migrant, Antonio Scarpa. Still bearing his name, the cellar was handed over to a family from Nizza Monferrato in the late 1940s. Mario Pesce, a young oenologist, acquired SCARPA after his studies in Burgundy and Alsace and managed the cellar throughout its success in the coming decades. Those are the years when the impeccable standards were set: excellent quality, sustainable agriculture, traditional winemaking methods. These are the benchmark standards to which we still work towards today.

Barbera d'Asti DOCG Casa Scarpa 2017

€ 15,00

This entry level Barbera bears the name of a simple, fresh, daily house wine. Rich in colour and taste, it highlights the main characters of Barbera grape with blackberry notes. Grapes come from one large plot at Poderi Bricchi estate harvested the first week of September.

Nebbiolo d'Alba DOCG Bric du Nota 2017

€ 25,00

Nebbiolo grapes coming from Roero area. The choice of this area is given to its general characteristic of elegance and lightness due to sandy soils. Although from another territory, these grapes suit our taste and philosophy quite well with traditional hues of roses and violet. Harvested the third week of September.

Barbera d'Asti Superiore DOCG La Bogliona 2015

€ 39,00

The most valuable wine of Scarpa, a symbol of the company. It is named after the entire side of the hill "La Bogliona" as it faces the village of Castel Boglione. 1974 is the first vintage but the vineyard was re-planted in 1988. The abundance of sand in the soil rich and magnesium is the reason of its elegance and saltiness. Deep and long notes of plum, cherry, mature red fruits. Harvested the second / third week of September.

Barbaresco DOCG Tettineive 2016

€ 55,00

Thanks to an official exception from legal provisions, Scarpa is part of a group of historical producers who have the right to produce, age and bottle Barolo, Barbaresco and Nebbiolo outside of their official territories. Our production of these wines anticipates the enforcement of such provisions (disciplinari, Barolo is 1966 for example) hence it is allowed to be continued. Barbaresco's Nebbiolo grapes have been purchased for years from the town of Neive, sub-area Cottà. Again, the gentleness and elegance of this grape is the reason for choosing Neive for our Barbaresco, whose aging potential lies in the range of 20-25 years. Harvested the third week of September / early October.

Barolo DOCG Tettimorra 2015

€ 63,00

The production right is the same of Barbaresco and Nebbiolo, as the story of the name. La Morra, sub-area Santa Maria has been the area of origin of our grapes thanks to its delicacy and elegant style. Roses, light flowers and soft tannins are the hallmarks of this wine. Great ageing potential over the decades. Harvested the third week of September / early October.

Early drinking wines bottled under Screwcap certainly have the advantage of retained freshness and no risk of cork taint spoilage. However, premium wines destined for long term maturation enjoy the added advantage of reduced bottle variation, which might otherwise result from premature oxidation over the years due to cork seals.

Will Screwcap seals allow wine to age?

Yes - the ageing of wine in a bottle is a function of the natural chemical characters in the wine and will occur over time - irrespective of the bottle closure. There is sufficient oxygen in the wine and in the head space to allow the part of development and ageing which requires oxygen to take place. Much of the development takes place anaerobically (i.e.: without oxygen)."

Are Screwcap wine seals here to stay?

Consider the following question, posed by New Zealand's Bob Campbell, Master of Wine:

"I have one question for all of the other winemakers who for the time being continue to use corks. If you know that Screwcaps will produce better and more consistent wine than corks, how can you continue to short-change your customers?"
